James and Endurance met in Dallas, Texas at One Community Church. James worked at the church as an intern for Dr. Conway Edwards and Endurance volunteered with the media ministry. They learned they shared a passion for giving back to those around the world who are in desperate need, and helping people see a better future. They were married on March 19, 2011 and spent their honeymoon in Honduras on a service trip. God worked in their hearts and prepared them to care for people around the world.

In the summer of 2012 the Myer's moved to Austin to be a part of Wells Branch Community Church. It is here 1520 Unreached was conceived and launched. Within two years an opportunity opened in Tanzania for the first global expedition. Tanzania is one of poorest 20 countries in the world with several pockets of unreached people groups. There is a tremendous need for education, agricultural development, and

leadership training. James, Endurance, and their son Moses permanently moved to Tanzania in the Summer of 2014 and launched their ministry. The Myer's welcomed their second son, Abel, in August 2016.

We are proud to support James and Endurance and their commitment to the people of Tanzania and their service through initiatives of albino care, digging wells, and farming.

HURRICANE RELIEF

Hurricane Harvey caused widespread, catastrophic flooding and damage in Texas and along the Gulf Coast. Many families were impacted, including families of our One Community Members. During this time, we issued a call to action (led by a family in our congregation and partnered with Amazon who donated a 54' container to transport) and our members responded. From the donations by our membership, two 18-wheeler semi's were packed to capacity with clothes (shirts, pants & socks), personal hygiene items, wipes (body & baby), diapers water and blankets in addition to raising \$90,000 during a special relief offering.

Our church strategically partnered with four local Houston churches (Living Word Fellowship Church, Houston First Baptist, The Church at Bethel's Family & Impact Church of the Woodlands) to assist their relief efforts as a way to help and allow the light of Christ to shine through His local Church.

These churches actively participated in rescue initiatives and identified 100 specific families who were in need of immediate assistance.

Here is one story from a family we assisted with our aid:

Lakresha is a member at City of Refuge Church. She serves with Genesis Works ministry and is the pastor's part-time administrative assistant. She has stage 4 bone and muscle cancer and had to be rescued from her apartment in Dickinson. She is living with her sister in an upstairs unit now, but she has lost everything. She is 28 years old. The hospital where her mother takes her for treatment has been closed due to the floods.

We ask that you continue to pray for those who are still filling the impact of Hurricane Harvey.




FATHERLESS INITIATIVE

So we launched an initiative. We dream of a church where no one walks alone, with a special heart to young boys with no father and single moms. Our Fatherless Initiative (180), is a mentoring program where male mentors dedicate themselves to training up our next generation of young men.

Boys ages 10-15, who live in the Denton County area and do not have a father present in their lives on a regular basis and their single moms/female custodial parents meet weekly to eat, have fun, learn about manhood and who God has called them to be and lastly build relationships with other Godly young men. Boys participate in career planning, life skills, team building, spiritual growth and more, while moms have the opportunity to fellowship with other moms and share each other's burdens.


TERESA'S STORY

There were many special moments sharing the Gospel in Cuba. One memorable moment was one of the most powerful movements of God that I have ever witnessed. As we approached one home, it was clear that they were participating in Santeria rituals involving sacrifices and idol worship. As we shared the Gospel, the elderly couple was very honest that they felt God knocking on their hearts, but they were afraid that their home and family would not be protected from evil spirits if they removed the altars they had built. We spent a lot of time in the Scriptures talking about idolatry and even almost left the home twice before the Spirit of God took over and moved mightily through worship and prayer and the family boldly proclaimed that they were ready to trust the Lord. As a further demonstration of their decision to trust in the Lord, they surrendered their idols. We packed them up, loaded them on a bicycle taxi, and took them back to a local church house to be destroyed. We rejoiced in God's victory singing, "There is power in the name of Jesus to break every chain!" You could feel the spirit of darkness flee as we bound spirits in the name of Jesus and welcomed God's presence in the home.

DANNI'S STORY

For as long as I can remember, I have wanted to go on a mission trip, but never felt like it was the right time or opportunity for me. When I came to One Community Church, I found that missions and outreach, discipleship and evangelism, are major components of what makes the church what it is. After nearly two years here at OneCC, I felt especially compelled to go on a mission trip this year, and I am really glad that I did.

Going to Southeast Asia was an amazing experience. There are many times that I have taken my freedom to serve God and share the Good News with other people for granted. But this trip gave me a different perspective and deeper appreciation for the religious freedom that we have in this country. The trip and my preparation for the trip made me think about how there are many times that we talk about what it means to live for God, but may not always fully consider that it could also mean to put our very lives on the line for God. What I experienced in Southeast Asia were people who loved God with all their hearts and who are willing to do anything to ensure that other people know about Him as well no matter the cost.

What impacted me the most was going to an orphanage and getting a chance to play with the children who are there. It was very heartbreaking to see so many children who have been abandoned, but it was a joy to see the workers who genuinely cared for the children. But to also get an opportunity to sponsor a child of my own long-term was the highlight of the entire trip for me. My heart is to go back to Southeast Asia on the next mission trip. To see what God is doing there in the lives of the people is encouraging and I hope that more people will come to support our brothers and sisters there so that all of China may know about the saving grace of Jesus Christ.



THE WEBER'S STORY

In the city of Baharona, clean water is a challenge for many families. Our job was to accompany local church leaders to homes in the community, explain how to use and clean the water with filters, and share the good news about how Jesus, just like the filter, makes us clean. To demonstrate the filter's effectiveness we added dirt to the water, ran it through the filter, and then drank it ourselves (which was a really important part of convincing folks that it was actually safe). The girls stepped up like champs, demonstrated and explained the water filters, drank the water that moments before had been filled with dirt (and other floaties) and shared their testimonies. It was a proud dad moment watching them overcome some fears and share the love of Jesus with others.

One of the men, Daly, was watching us demonstrate the water filter for a woman he had been visiting with when we arrived. After we explained the water filter and the Gospel, the woman, Santa, told us she wanted to give her life to Christ and prayed with us to do so. Daly had not said a word the entire time. We then turned and asked him if he was a follower of Jesus. He shared that, though his father was a pastor, he was not a Christian and also wanted to receive Christ!

We also had several opportunities to work with different groups of children from the community. All of the young people on our team worked hard ahead of time to prepare skits, Bible stories and activities for the kids. It was really a privilege getting to watch all our kids use their gifts for God's glory. Our prayer is that they will carry that conviction home with them and recognize opportunities every day to do the same thing right where God has placed them.
